# PARIS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY LIVESTOCK GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

(see also Special Class Rules)

**ADULT EXHIBITOR FEE \$10.00. JUNIOR EXHIBITORS (18 and under)** are free. Junior exhibitors entering an adult class must pay an exhibitor fee.

**ENTRY FEES** are in addition to an exhibitor fee for some classes.

20% entry fee is deducted from each exhibitor who has been awarded total cash prize money of \$5.00 or more from the following classes: Heavy Horse, Sheep, Goat, Cattle.

**NOTE:** 100% of above mentioned deductions are applied to the cost of administering prizes.

## ENTRIES

1. **DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES IS AUGUST 21st** (except where noted):
2. Make your entries online at [parisfairgrounds.com](http://parisfairgrounds.com), email [exhibit@parisfairgrounds.com](mailto:exhibit@parisfairgrounds.com), mail P.O. Box 124, Paris N3L 3E7, or in person at the Fair office.
3. **ALL ENTRIES** must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor. In the case of every article, product, and chattel exhibited, the said article, product or chattel must be the actual production, growth or manufacture, as the case may be, of the person exhibiting same. The Directors of the Society shall discard all soiled or defaced work and instruct Judges to award prizes to new & up to date work.
4. **NO ENTRY FEE REFUND** for scratches in Horse Shows unless a certificate from the Show Veterinarian is presented.
5. **Livestock Exhibitor Fair Entry passes:**  
**All individuals** (Exhibitors, family members of Exhibitors, show string helpers, leadsperson, trailer/truck drivers and spectators) will require a pass to gain entrance to the fairgrounds each day.  
1-5 animals entered = 3 complementary passes  
5+ animals entered = additional 2 passes.  
(ie 8 animals entered = 5 complementary passes)  
Exhibitor passes will be emailed to you directly from PAS.  
If additional tickets are required, please visit or contact the fairgrounds office 519-442-2823 or order online at <https://bit.ly/3xs6qwz>.

## JUDGING

6. Any exhibitor who interferes with judges while engaged in making their awards, either by conversation or under any pretense, will result in forfeiture of all prizes to which they might otherwise be entitled and will be promptly excluded from competition. The decision of the judge is final; no appeal will be considered.
7. **PROTEST** may be made against irregularity or breach of rules by any exhibitor or interested party. A deposit of \$25.00 must accompany the written protest which will be retained by the PAS if the protest is not sustained. The President and Vice-Presidents shall be a committee to decide on the protest, and their decision is final.
8. **ALL LIVESTOCK shall be free of disease** and accompanied by a certificate of health or vaccination, if applicable. They are subject to inspection by the Show Veterinarian, who has the power to remove exhibits from the grounds.
9. While the Directors will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to secure the safety of animals sent to the exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting. Should any animal be accidentally injured, damaged, lost or stolen, the Directors will give all the assistance in their power toward the recovery, but will not make payment for the value thereof.

## PRIZES

10. Judges are instructed to award prizes to worthy exhibits. It is the intention of the Paris Fair to give no distinction or premium of any kind to an animal that is not deserving of such awards.

11. **LIVESTOCK PRIZE MONEY** over \$5.00 will be mailed in October. Prize money under \$5.00 WILL NOT be mailed. All premiums not taken up by November 30th shall be forfeited to PAS.

12. **IN CASE of insufficient funds due to weather or other conditions noted in item 14**, PAS reserves the right to pay only a percentage of the prizes awarded for exhibits.

## POWERS OF THE SOCIETY

13. The interpretation of these rules and regulations is made by the managing committee of the PAS, and their decision will be final. In case of a printing error in the prize list, the Society will have the final decision.

## HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

14. Upon making an entry or display, the Exhibitor shall indemnify and hold harmless the PAS, their directors, officers and members from and against all claims, demands, losses, costs, damages, actions, suits or proceedings by any third parties that may arise out of, or may attribute to, all operations performed by or carried out by the Exhibitor, his agents, employees, or anyone for whose acts he may be at law be responsible, howsoever caused.

The Exhibitor agrees that if and whenever and to the extent that the PAS may be prevented, delayed or restricted in whole or in part from holding the Paris Fair by reason of any cause beyond the PAS's control including, without limitation, strikes or work stoppages, Acts of God, pandemic or public health restriction or the passing of any statute law or regulation, the PAS shall have no responsibility for any loss or damages sustained by the Exhibitor.

## MEDIA CONSENT

15. PAS takes photographs and video images of events and exhibits during Paris Fair. These photos and videos may be used by the PAS on their website, FaceBook, other social media outlets and print advertising. By attending and exhibiting at Paris Fair you consent to the use of images and photos in whole or in part for advertising and promotional purposes. You waive the right to privacy and financial compensation of any and all images used.

## TAG REGULATIONS

16. CFIA TAGS: Please be aware that all livestock (cattle, sheep & pigs) must arrive with CFIA tags, they are to be tagged before they leave the farm. Should they arrive without tag, and the Inspectors discover this, you are putting **YOURSELF** at risk of a \$1,300.00 fine, as well as \$1,300.00 for the trucker and another \$1,300.00 fine for the PAS. The PAS is **NOT** a tagging station for livestock. **Any untagged livestock will not be permitted to show grounds.**

## ANIMAL EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Livestock and poultry must be transported to and from fairgrounds in a manner that is in accordance with all humane standards.

Animals should be prepared with proper grooming.

Excessive disciplining of animals at Paris Fair is not acceptable and will not be tolerated.

Consumption of alcohol and/or smoking in the livestock sheds, tents and/or show ring is prohibited.

Glass containers should not be taken into the livestock area. Stalls must be free of garbage (including string) and manure placed in the dedicated space.

Any misuse or damage to livestock areas may result in the denial of future entry to events at the Paris Fairgrounds.

1. Special rules governing Horses - The 2 and 3 year olds, driving and other horses will be allowed to show in more than one section of the same class.
2. The Society shall allow two horses, although owned by different exhibitors, to compete for the team prizes providing each owner is an exhibitor.
3. All Horses in harness to be hitched to a suitable wheeled vehicle.
4. Multiple Hitches - Horses not necessarily owned by one exhibitor and no entry fee over the regular 20 percent of Prize Money.
5. All Horses being exhibited at the Fair are to be negative to an immunodiffusion test (Coggins test) for Equine Infectious Anemia tested within one year of the date. A certificate is to be made available to the Fair Board Officials, if requested.
6. Entries to be submitted to Fair office by August 20th, which is strongly preferred, but will also be taken at the ringside registration tables.
7. All exhibitors must procure, at the ringside registration tables, exhibitor identification numbers to be worn by all showmen when exhibiting horses.
- 8. All Exhibitors must pay a \$10.00 Exhibitor Fee to the Paris Agricultural Society.**
9. All entry fees included (deducted) in the prize money.

3. Only 2 breeds may be exhibited by any one exhibitor.
4. All entries must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor.
5. Number of Entries: Limited to one entry per section, per exhibitor, except that the Paris Fair has authorized two entries per exhibitor per section, to a maximum of two sections.
6. The maximum number of entries in breeding class per exhibitor is six.
7. (a) No person may make an entry as an individual and as a farm or limited company. (b) All animals, whether owned by one person or more than one person (individually or jointly) which are maintained as one farm or breeding unit are considered to be the production of one farm or breeding unit. Therefore only one animal per section is eligible from such a unit. (c) Any person who shares any portion of a joint ownership in any animal entered, shall be precluded from showing another animal in his own or farm name in the same section.
8. All general rules of the Paris Fair and those of the 2022 Canada Department of Agriculture, Livestock Classification will apply.
9. Prize Money will be withheld if exhibits are removed before judging is completed.

# CATTLE SHOW

## CATTLE SHOW GENERAL RULES

All cattle must be on the grounds **by 10:00 a.m. and remain until end of show unless otherwise specified in Class Rules.** Exhibitors leaving before this time without permission will forfeit their prize money. All exhibitors must pay an exhibitor fee of \$10.00. General rules of the Agricultural Society to govern. Entry fee will be 20 percent of prize money won. Exhibitors must be ready to exhibit their animals when called.

All cattle **TRUCKS** must be removed from the grounds as soon as unloaded and parked in the areas designated for this purpose.

### ENTRIES:

**Definition of an Entry** - All registered Cattle, whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly) which are maintained on one farm or breeding unit, are considered to be the production of one farm or breeding unit.

No cow will be allowed to compete for premiums unless giving milk when shown, or visibly in calf at the time. Female cattle under three years old, giving milk, may be shown as cows in the herd or group sections.

All purebred animals must be registered and pedigrees must be produced at the Fair when requested by the Directors in charge. Junior calves exempt from this rule demanding pedigrees.

All entries must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor.

The Show Veterinarian has the final say on the health of the livestock exhibited.

**Liability Insurance for a minimum of \$1 million is mandatory.**

**Proof of coverage will be required during online registration (have it ready).**

**IMPORTANT:** "Providing there are three or more exhibitors who exhibit at least 24 animals the prize schedule for each section listed with each breed of cattle will be paid, otherwise only 50 percent of this amount will be paid."

Straw only for bedding (not supplied) - no sawdust  
Place manure in the proper area (bring a wheelbarrow).

## CODE OF ETHICS FOR DAIRY SHOWS

While presenting a positive image to spectators, the following supports good animal husbandry both at home and at a show.

### PART I

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as unethical in the show ring of registered dairy cattle:

1. misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown
2. filling an animal unnaturally with liquid (tubing)
3. balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters
4. treating the udder, internally or externally with an irritant, counterirritant, or any other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation
5. administering epidural anesthesia (blocking tails)
6. performing surgery of any kind to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and

trimming of hooves.

7. inserting foreign material/articles under the skin, into the topline or on the feet

8. roping udders

9. criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or show

## **PART II**

The provisions of this part apply to entries of a breed regulated by a breed association which has adopted this part.

1. If intended for use in contravention of the Code of Ethics, no exhibitor and no agent, employee or other person acting on behalf of an exhibitor, shall have in his or her possession or control any hypodermic syringe, needle or other device, swabs, cloths, or other material, or any medicine, preparation or substance, whether in liquid or any other form.

2. Exhibitors will not be allowed to wrap hocks or drain fluid from hocks at a show unless authorized by a veterinarian at the show.

3. All entries and the personal property of all exhibitors, their servants and agents and persons acting on behalf of exhibitors, are subject to inspection by inspectors authorized by a show. All such persons shall co-operate with the inspectors and shall provide all such information in connection with such inspections and shall provide access to the animal and all information reasonably required by inspectors in connection with such inspections and shall provide, if so requested, samples of urine and blood suitable for analysis. Exhibitors shall also remove any udder supports, blankets or other objects limiting the ability of the inspector to undertake a thorough inspection. In particular, the inspectors shall be informed, in advance, of the nature of any medicine, treatment or substance administered to any entry and the reasons therefor. Inspections under this paragraph may be carried out at any time while the animal is at the show and elsewhere in the period ending 30 days after the termination of the show between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.

4. Any inspector may, at any time, require the delivery to him of any hypodermic syringe, needle or other device, swabs, cloths or other material, or samples or any medicine, preparation or substance, whether in liquid or other form, in the possession or control of the exhibitor, his servants, agents or persons acting on behalf of the exhibitor for the purposes of laboratory analysis.

5. (A) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (B), the following entries are disqualified and shall not participate further in the show in which the entry is disqualified.

(i) Any animal determined by an inspector, who is also a veterinarian, to have an udder manifesting any of the following: localized swelling, oedema, erythema, sensitivity, reddening, firmness, warmth or exfoliation of the skin, but excluding general oedema associated with parturition or mastitis, or a sore in the area where the large blood vessels enter the udder.

(ii) Any animal entered by an exhibitor whose servants, agents or persons acting on his behalf, fails to co-operate in the inspection provided for under paragraphs 3 or 4.

(B) The inspector's determination pursuant to subparagraph (A)(i) is subject to an appeal by the exhibitor to the appeal committee appointed by the show for the purpose. Any such appeal must be made by notice in writing delivered to the show management within 1 hour of notification of the inspector's determination. In keeping with the basic philosophy of the fair/exhibition/show committee, ethics are an individual responsibility. However, it should be understood that violators are subject to disciplinary provisions of the Rules and Regulations.
